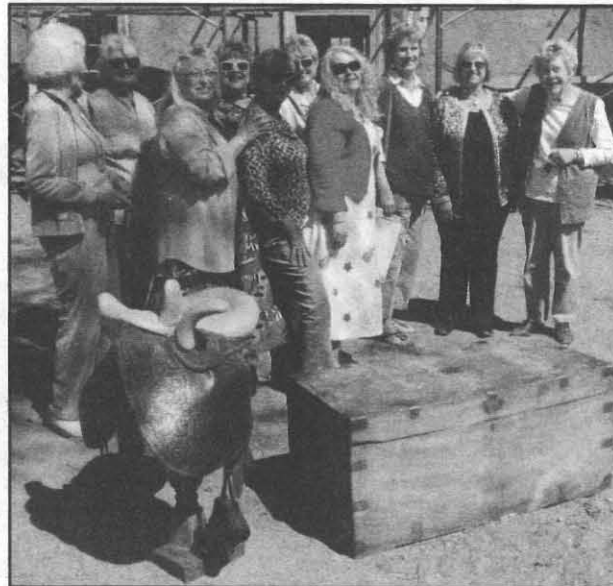

Quester Chapter 1351 Cinco Ciudades recently presented two new acquisitions to the Dana Adobe Nipomo Amigos.

The first is an 1840s camphor wood trunk used by Californio families such as the Danas to store and protect their clothing, tex-

tiles and other goods. The second gift is a lady's side saddle made by J.P. Hoefler Co. of San Luis Obispo prior to 1899.

The gifts — which were purchased with a special grant awarded from the national antiques and history international organization Questers 1944 — will be on display at the Dana Adobe.

The San Luis Obispo County Community Foundation recently presented the fifth annual Isabel P. Ruiz Humanitarian Award to Jack's Helping Hand charitable administrator Mary Illingworth.

The award recognizes local individuals for outstand-

ing efforts in advocacy and caring for local people in San Luis Obispo County.

Illingworth was a special education teacher before retirement and was administrative assistant for Easter Seals and then Life Span services.

She played a leading role in starting and running the nonprofit Jack's Helping Hand in 2005.
